Concentration	 Listening and responding to stories; particularly sequencing the events in a story Responding to complex instructions Following instructions when playing games in small groups Developing self-control during short carpet sessions 	 Read stories together and talk about what happens next Give your child instructions to follow for example: "Please can you find the large spoon and the blue cup"
Independence	 Self-help skills eg toileting and hygiene, dressing independently and lunchtime routines including using a knife and fork Learning new Reception routines Being responsible for their own belongings eg jumpers and book bags Choose resources to play with and tidy them away 	 Encourage your child to independently get dressed and undressed. Help them to use a knife and fork and to learn to cut their food. Encourage your child to carry their belongings to school.
Communication and Collaboration	 Listening to stories and then retelling them using story refrains and different character voices Developing complex vocabulary (story language & descriptive language) Working together in groups to create imaginative games or build using construction materials 	 Encourage your child to retell the story in his own words. Talk about the characters and the events in the stories. Arrange play dates
Perseverance	 Problem solving such as making a home for a pet or a farm house on the farm. Develop determination to complete a tricky task, eg completing a puzzle 	Encourage your child to have another go when they find something difficult and to think of another way to solve a problem
Imagination	 Role playing animal stories and making up their own version of these stories Exploring colour, texture and media in art activities Developing their singing skills and ability to discriminate between long and short musical sounds 	 Read animal stories together Encourage imaginative play using story characters
Curiosity	 Exploring and learning about materials Exploring the natural environment and identifying features of living things Questioning why things happen and how things work 	Look at different materials in the environment. Use all the senses to explore them and use words to describe them
Risk Taking	 Developing fundamental movement and travelling skills in PE Learning from mistakes when making things eg making houses and homes for animals from construction materials Physical challenges in the woods or on climbing apparatus 	 Support your child in having a go at something new Try a new piece of apparatus at the play ground

Empathy	 Learning our fair rules Showing care for living things Being aware of other people's feelings and emotions Showing kindness to their friends at school 	Talk with your child about how the characters in the stories are feeling; for example The Little Red Hen when her friends didn't help her.
Wisdom	 Use our initiative to come back to unfinished activities Use experiences learnt in school and apply them across other areas of the classroom environment Learn to solve problems through conversation 	 Talk with your child about taking ownership over little jobs around the house Speak in full sentences and speak proudly about an accomplishment.

Concentration	 Listening and responding to stories; particularly sequencing the events in a story Show increasing memory capacity Following instructions using Bee-Bot and in games related to the stories. Simple and multi-level Sustains involvement in a variety of activities 	 Read stories together and talk about what happens next Play simple games such as pairs or "The Tray Game"
Independence	 Self-help skills e,g. organising their own belongings Know and follow all routines. Initiates play independently. Accessing resources independently. 	 Encourage your child to manage fastening their own clothes such as zips and buttons. Encourage your child to tidy away their toys at home
